Dear Parent,

Please use this calendar as a daily guide to help encourage development of your child's language skills at home. Each day, please ask your child the question suggested for that date. This calendar targets skills such as: naming items in categories, explaining the meaning of idioms, providing synonyms or antonyms for a target word, labeling regular or irregular plurals, forming sentences with a target word or words, recalling & repeating spoken information (numbers/ sentences), and following multi-step spoken directions.

*Synonym: words that mean the same thing, or nearly the same thing. For example: nice/ kind

*Antonym: words that mean the opposite. For example: mean/ nice

*Idiom: expression with a different meaning than the literal meaning. For example: "It's raining cats & dogs" REALLY means "It's raining really hard"
